Objectives and Investment Policy

The Company aims to achieve growth in value (through a combination of growth of capital and income), net of fees, with a target return of the UK's Consumer Prices Index (the CPI) plus 4%, on average, over 7 year rolling periods. There is no guarantee that a return will be achieved over a 7 year period, or any other period and capital is at risk.

To achieve the objective, the Company will have exposure to a global portfolio which will typically comprise at least 60% equities. The remainder of the Scheme Property will be invested in fixed income assets (which may include government and public securities), alternative asset classes and cash. The composition of the Scheme Property as between equities, fixed income and other asset classes will vary depending on the Investment Managers' assessment of market conditions as well as the economic environment. The exposure to equities may fall below 60% where equity markets are considered as over valued by the Investment Managers or other asset classes can provide a better risk adjusted return. In addition to equities, the Company may also invest in other transferable securities, including warrants, money markets instruments, deposits and cash or near cash investments. The Company may also invest in alternatives (i.e. gold, commodities, illiquid strategies and property) which will be held indirectly via permitted investments such as collective investment schemes and permitted closed-ended investment funds. Between 50% and 100% of the Company's exposure will be gained through the use of regulated and unregulated collective investment vehicles (including open ended funds and permitted closed-ended investment funds, such as investment trusts, and ETFs) which may include collective investment vehicles managed by the ACD or its associates or the Investment Managers or their associates. The allocation to collective investment vehicles will vary within the range of 50-100% depending on markets and to take advantage of the expertise available via funds. All other exposure will be attained from direct investments. Derivatives may be used for the purposes of Efficient Portfolio Management (including hedging) although use is expected to be limited. The ACD has appointed multiple Investment Managers with different investment styles to achieve the investment objective. Allocations to the Investment Managers are subject to change in order to meet the Company's investment objective and further details regarding the allocations are available upon request from the ACD. The Investment Managers will actively manage the Company. This means the Investment Managers actively make decisions about how to invest the Scheme Property (and which investments to buy and sell) instead of simply following a market index.

The Company's performance is measured against the CPI plus 4%. The CPI has been selected as a performance target because it is a key measure of consumer inflation in the United Kingdom. The Company aims to deliver positive returns of the CPI plus 4%, on average, over 7 year rolling periods. The CPI is therefore an appropriate target for the Company.

The base currency of the Fund is pounds sterling.

Income arising from the Fund is distributed to the holders of income shares, and reinvested in the case of accumulation shares. Investors can buy and sell shares on demand when the scheme prices daily at 12 midday.


