Objectives and Investment Policy

To generate income through a portfolio of investments over the longer term (5 year rolling period).

There is also the potential for capital growth, although that is not the focus of the fund. The Fund's core exposure will be to bonds (49 -79%) and equities (between 16 and 46%), with more of an emphasis on bonds, and in each case across any geographical sector. The above exposure will be gained primarily (70% or more) through the use of collective investment vehicles (including those managed or operated by the ACD or its associate). All other exposure will be attained from direct investments.

All bond allocations will be in sterling or sterling hedged instruments. At the Investment Manager's discretion, the Fund may also invest in other transferable securities, money market instruments, cash and near cash. The Fund will be actively managed which means the Investment Manager decides which investments to buy and sell, and when.

The base currency of the Fund is pounds sterling.

Income arising from the Fund is distributed to the holders of income shares, and reinvested in the case of accumulation shares. Investors can buy and sell shares on demand when the scheme prices daily at 12 midday.

The risk rating of the Fund is category 4 due to the volatility of the Fund price which sits in a range of between 5% and 10%. The risk rating is calculated using historical data and a prescribed standard deviation methodology.


